What you'll need when you come to camp:

- Bedding **WILL NOT** be provided, you must bring your own. This is a change from previous years.
- Comfortable but appropriate clothing; short shorts, tank tops, spaghetti straps, etc. are not allowed. Remember, you are representing yourself, your team and ultimately the National FFA Organization!
- One set of **COMPLETE** Official Dress.
- Sturdy, comfortable shoes (we will be doing a lot of walking/hiking)
- Any knee, ankle or other braces that you need for walking on rough terrain
- Any medications that you normally take including inhalers, insulin, etc.
- You must have a signed and completed medical release form approved by the State Alumni Association. Ag Advisors remember to bring these with you as your chapter cannot attend camp unless these are turned into the Alumni Representative on site.
- Towels, soap and other sundry items
- Chapter POA to be completed
- If you have one, a copy of your personal mission statement
- Camera and film
- Flashlight for after dark hikes.
- Extra money for pop, candy, etc.
- Musical instruments, tapes, CDs, etc. if you would like to try out for banquet talent or for flag raising and lowering.
- Appropriate swimsuit or shorts that you don't mind getting wet
- Baseball glove/bat/ball or any other sporting equipment you would like to bring
- Fly fishing is available on site on a catch and release basis
- Your opening ceremonies part need to be memorized. You will have the opportunity to conduct opening and closing ceremonies during the general sessions.
